The English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

- The EBacc is a measure which recognises when students have secured a grade 4 or better, across a range of academic GCSE subjects. These are: -
 1. **English**
 2. **Mathematics**
 3. **Science**
 4. **History or Geography**
 5. **A Modern Foreign Language (MFL)**
- This combination is meant to ensure that students have the opportunity to study a broad range of subjects at GCSE.
- These are the subjects which may maximise the choices of degree courses open to students at the prestigious Russell Group of universities.
